EASTER BUNNY DRIVE

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

An Easter twist on the classic game of 'Beetle Drive'.

Play this game with others in your house. Each player will need a pen and paper and then a dice between you. Use the 'Bunny Drive' sheet at the bottom of this pack to help play the game.

How to Play: Take turns to roll a dice and add the body part to your bunny. You must throw a 6 first (head) in order to start drawing.

Carry on rolling the dice in turns, adding the body parts to your bunny. You can only add one body part on at a time. So, if you get a four, add on only one eye and you must roll another four later on, in order to add the second eye. This is the same with the ears and whiskers

Once someone has drawn a complete bunny - 1 head, 2 ears, 2 eyes, 1 nose, 6 whiskers, 1 bow - they then shout BUNNY and the game finishes. Play a few rounds and then award a prize to the overall winner.

DIY BUBBLE WANDS







PREPARATION NEEDED





GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Get outside and create the largest bubbles you can using DIY bubble wands.

Bubble Wands: Use kitchen utensils to create your bubble wands. You'll need utensils which have holes in. Spatulas, mashers, whisks etc. are some good examples to start with. Please don't use any with sharp edges.

Bubble Mixture: If you don't have bubble mixture then you can create your own. In a large bowl carefully mix together 50ml (1 part) washing up liquid with 300ml (6 parts) of water. Mix this together carefully as you don't want to create too many bubbles at this point. Let it rest for a few minutes.

Challenge: Using the different utensils, dip them into the bubble mixture and then blow bubbles. How big can you make a bubble? Which utensil creates the best bubble? Which utensil creates the most bubbles?

CHOCOLATE EASTER NESTS





GET CREATIVE



30 MINUTES



PREPARATION NEEDED



GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Create some tasty Easter themed treats for your family to share.

In a small bowl, melt the chocolate. This can be done in a microwave or over a pan of simmering water. A grown-up should do this bit.

Crush the shredded wheat (or other cereal like Rice Krispies or Cornflakes) into a bowl and then pour the melted chocolate over the top.

Mix together and then spoon into the cupcake cases. In the centre of the nest, use a spoon to create an indent. This will become the centre of the nest and where you should place two or three mini eggs.

Chill the nests in the fridge until set. Once set you can eat and enjoy them with your family!



WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- · 200g Milk Chocolate
- 85g Shredded Wheat (or other cereal)
- Mini Eggs
- Bowl & Spoon
- Cupcake Cases

THE EASTER STORY EGG HUNT

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Learn about the Easter story whilst doing an Easter egg hunt.

Ask a grown-up to: Print out the Easter story sequence cards and cut them up. If you don't have a printer, they can be written onto pieces of paper. Hide the sequence cards around the house. Leave a small chocolate, mini egg or sweet with the card.

Now for your challenge: Go around the house finding the sequence cards and the sweets. Once you have found all 7 you now need to try and put the cards into the correct order (the correct order is how they are on the worksheet).

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

For this activity, you'll need lots of imagination in order to create a colourful and cheerful Easter card.

First, you'll need a piece of paper or card. Fold this in half to create your greetings card. Now decorate the front of the card with images from Easter. You could draw or paint them, or you could use materials from the paper bin to create a colourful collage.

Images for the front of the card may include the Easter bunny, Easter eggs, chicks, etc. Or you may wish to draw pictures from the Easter story, such as the empty tomb or the cross.

Once finished, write a nice message inside and then give it to someone in your house.

PREPARATION NEEDED



GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Test your taste buds and see how many food items you can get correct in a blindfolded taste test.

Before this activity a grown-up will need to get ready 5 or more different food items to taste test. These might include items such as banana, apple, baked beans, mashed potato, custard, chocolate, tomato sauce, pasta, crisps etc.

Close your eyes, or be blindfolded with a tea towel, and one at a time eat each food item and try to work out what it is. How many can you get correct?

Taking it Further: You could now be the one in charge and create a taste test for someone else in the house. You'll need a grown-up to help you with this. Can your family member beat your score?
