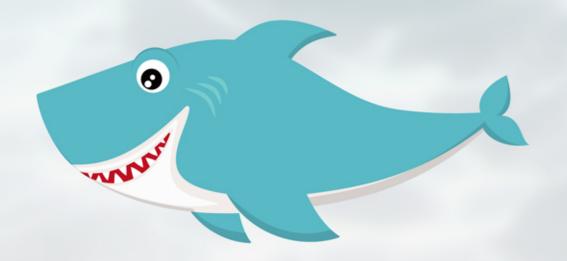

### **GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY**

Use your imagination to bring shark infested waters to life. Can you feed the sharks without being eaten yourself?

Set up 5 or 6 stepping stones (books, cushions etc) a small distance apart. A couple of metres past the last stepping stone place a bucket - this will represent the shark's mouth.

Start the game by placing a bean bag or similar (sock balls, sponge) on your head. This is the shark bait which needs to get into the shark's mouth (bucket). Carefully jump between stepping stones, whilst balancing the bean bag on your head. Be careful not to fall off a stepping stone or drop the shark bait, otherwise you'll get eaten by the sharks and need to start the course again. Throw the bean bag into the shark's mouth to feed it and head back to the start.

How many bean bags can you successfully get through the course and into the shark's mouth without falling into the shark infested waters? Score a point for every bean bag in the shark's mouth.

Explore your local area and keep an eye out for the colours of the rainbow in nature. Can you find all the colours of the rainbow?

With your family, head out on a walk around your local area. For this activity, it would be ideal to visit your local park, nature reserve or country park - somewhere where plants, flowers and trees can be found.

Your task is to try and find all the colours of the rainbow in natural items around you. When you find each colour, take a photo of that plant, animal, flower etc. Can you find all 7 colours on your walk?

**Take it further:** Try to find 2 or 3 shades of each colour on your walk. Can you find light blue and dark blue objects for example? How many different shades of green can you find?

Become a member of the Queen's Guard, the soldiers who help protect the Queen, with this creative activity.

Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> June 2020 should have been Trooping the Colour, a big parade of soldiers helping to mark the Queen's official birthday. Trooping the Colour normally features over 1400 soldiers, 200 horses and 400 musicians. If you've not seen it before, search 'Trooping the Colour' on YouTube to watch some videos.

This year HM The Queen is celebrating her 94th birthday. Become one of the Queen's Guard, the famous soldiers, by using the template at the bottom of this pack. Firstly you'll need to find a photograph of you to cut out your face and stick it onto the face of the soldier in the template. If you can't do that, then draw your face on instead. Finish it off by colouring in the soldier's famous red and black uniform. Now you've become one of the Queen's Guard! How do you look?

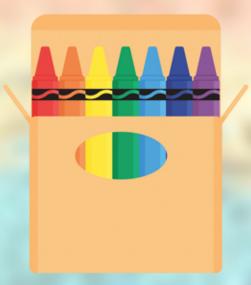

## **GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY**

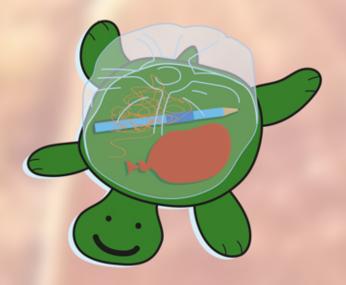

### **GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY**

A reminder of how the plastic waste we produce can end up harming the ocean creatures we love. Linked to World Oceans Day (8th June).

Create a turtle by asking a grown-up to cut off the bottom of a 2L bottle. Cut out the turtle from the template or draw your own. Use green card for the turtle base if you can, or colour it in yourself. Stick the bottle to the turtle base using sellotape. Before doing that, fill the turtle with colourful plastic waste such as food, sweets and crisps packaging.

Your plastic turtle may look good, but inside its stomach is lots of plastic waste. This happens in our oceans every day. Animals such as turtles eat plastic, harming and sometime killing them. We can stop this by using less plastic and recycling more. Think about 5 ways you could pledge to use less and recycle more. Could you reuse carrier bags and bottles for example? Write down your pledges and try and make the changes to help protect our oceans.

On the worksheet are two pictures which look the same, but actually have small differences for you to spot. Look between the photos and see if you can find all 10 differences? How long did it take you to find them all?

They might turn a lamp on, remove a cushion, change seats etc. Come back in the room and see if you can 'spot the difference'. Now send a family member out the room and you create the differences.
